Once again Callan's means to an end is petty criminal Lonely, the most frightened little man in the underworld. It is Lonely who gets him the gun, a Noguchi Magnum 38 calibre. A magnum for Schneider.

The operation is fraught with complications, but Callan's own inhibitions are the most dangerous.
