Widely admired by both fans and critics, many of Britain's leading male dancers were her partners. Latterly Rudolf Nureyev reinvigorated her career, as she continued to perform around the world.

She married Panamanian diplomat, Dr Roberto Arias in 1955, and cared for him after he was nearly paralyzed in an assassination attempt in 1964.

Awarded a CBE in 1950, she became a Dame in 1956. Dame Margot Fonteyn died aged 71 in 1991.

Redefining the style of 20th century British ballet, the impact she made lives on.
